MINI Cooper Cabin Air Filter Replacement

Have you changed your cabin air filter? Many people realize that changing your engine's air filter once a year will allow your engine to breathe better! Most people don't realize that changing or up grading your cabin's air filter will allow YOU to breathe better!

Spring is just rounding the corner and the entire winter you have been operating your vehicle with windows closed. If you live in one of the hotter and more humid states you most likely operate your vehicle with windows closed and A/ C on most of the year. Doing so will trap stale air and airborne germs, bacteria, and dust particles. If you are a smoker the situation is worst since these odors penetrate the headliner, carpeting, and upholstery. One of the biggest culprits for introducing contaminants is the shoes from the drivers and passengers. Since on all vehicles the A/C intake system is near the passengers and driver foot well area, any dirt, dust, mud, and debris deposited into the carpet during the winter was eventually fired at your face the first time you felt a need to turn your A/C on high during late spring.

In the past, automotive air conditioning recirculation systems would filter the cabin air through a very porous foam type filter element. These types of cabin filter elements were not a serviceable item, access was virtually impossible, and the foam would typically deteriorate after about 6 years. The assumption was always that the air in your vehicle was relatively

clean.



MINIs are equipped with a small A/C cabin filter element. The filters are designed to trap all dust and/or solid particles. This is a major improvement over the window screen style filtration of the 70's and 80's. Unfortunately most car owners are not aware that this item even exists and requires annual replacement, and more often in dusty areas that have high vehicle population. The only indication that you would

experience is that the A/C does not seem to have the force that it did

when the vehicle was new. Similar to a dirty engine filter, restriction reduces airflow and volume. I have discovered that to increase flow volume in some vehicles, dirty cabin filters had been removed and discarded without installing a replacement element. This does increase A/C pressure however it contaminates the ventilation system and clogs the



A/C evaporator core.

Check our web site to see if a cabin filter is available for your vehicle. As an option, many applications offer an active carbon filter element that not only filters out solid particles, but also cigarette and pet odors. This is a great solution to the musky damp odor of a smoker's vehicle during A/C operation.







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MINI Cooper Cabin Air Filter Installation

Changing the cabin air filter in your MINI is a very quick but necessary thing to do each year. Simply start by removing the cabin air filter cover from the underside of your glove box.



Pull the factory cabin air filter out making note of which way the filter was positioned. Slide in a new Electrostatic Cabin Air Filter or Carbon Cabin Air Filter and reinstall the cover.



Below are a couple images of a dirty cabin air filter from a MINI with only 5,000 miles. You can see how dirty it has become in only 5,000 miles; imagine what one would look like after a full year or two worth of driving.









2016 Autocross

Ohio Valley Region / Porsche Club of America will kick off the 2016 autocross season with five events starting in April and ending in September. Racing will be held at Forest Fair Mall, the current location of Bass Pro Shops, near the intersection of I-275 (exit 39) and Winton Road, north of Cincinnati.

For those new to the sport, autocross is a fun and exciting way to drive your vehicle on a small track against the clock plus we have instructors. Drivers will maneuver around a cone lined course with sharp curves, slaloms, straightaways and tight handling situations. All of this is accomplished in a safe and controlled environment with one driver on course at a time. Safety is the primary focus at an autocross.

There are a few changes to the 2016 season. A later start time, a 15 minute lunch break and the entry fee is just \$30 per driver. Awards are given to fastest time in class, most clean runs, best time in each run group and year end champions plus year end prizes at the annual meeting.

Startup time on race day will be 9am, with registration, tech inspections, track familiarity, morning briefing and a scheduled 15 minute lunch break. This schedule should allow us to wrap everything up by 2:00 pm. Yes, we will have un-timed fun runs after 2:00 pm for anyone who wants to extend the fun. There will be a new course layout that proves to be more challenging and longer than our 2015 season course.

Autocross is an inexpensive way to gather like minded people, push your driving limits, learn about safe handling in your vehicle and have fun. The events are open to drivers with valid driver's licenses, Porsche not required. We are hoping for more participation from other car clubs in the surrounding area so feel free to invite your friends. All manufacturers are welcome! Last year we had some very fast cars including: Miatas, Corvettes, Mercedes, Camaros, VWs, and Scions.

Time: The main gate opens before 9:00 AM. Registration is the first 20 cars with up to 25 drivers. Preference may be given to Ohio Valley AHC members. The maximum is usually reached BEFORE 10:00 AM. Runs start as soon as possible. Glean up and awards about 3:30. The more help picking up cones and cleaning the earlier we leave.

Cost: \$25.00 per Driver - Max - 25 drivers - spectators free! - Rain or Shine

Everyone will be required to sign a waiver and all drivers are required to work the course when not driving. Bring chairs and a cooler; there is shade available. No alcohol.

Required Equipment: A safe / functioning car (we will inspect it) any make or model, the cooler the better Helmets are required for drivers and passengers. There are usually loaners available.

Goal: "Fun & Family Oriented Gymkhana" Meaning - street legal tires driven to the event only (no tire changing is allowed); No trailered cars unless they arc vintage European or Japanese. We may give out awards for improvement over the day i.e., training.

This event is designed to be a safe, fun way to enjoy your automobile. No dangerous driving or recklessness will be tolerated. We operate near a residential section and ask that the exhaust system be street legal for noise.

Regardless; we reserve the right to determine if it toooo loud. We want to come back next year.

We would like to see more vintage iron in 2015.... Remember - you are competing against yourself, not others * come out and have some fun with your car!



This year, we're visiting car museums: The Auburn-Cord-Duesenberg Museum, The Gilmore Car Museum, and The Henry Ford complex. The focus is on the museums, not the driving, so we'll have quite a few miles on Interstates.

On Friday, May 20, we'll leave the Waffle House on Tylersville Road at Cox at 8:30 – come earlier if you want to have breakfast there. We'll head north on I-75, then west on U.S. routes to Fort Wayne to I-69 to Auburn, IN where we'll have lunch. We'll spend the afternoon exploring the Auburn-Cord-Duesenberg Museum (\$12.50 admission), then head north to Battle Creek, MI for the night at the Courtyard by Marriott Battle Creek.

On Saturday, May 21, we'll leave the hotel at 9:00 for Hickory Corners and a day at the Gilmore Car Museum (\$12 admission). Lunch will be at The Blue Moon Diner or the Heritage Café in the Gilmore's 90-acre complex. By 5:00, we'll be on the road to Dearborn and The Dearborn Inn. Dinner will be on the road, then we'll make a trip to Shatila's for ice cream after checking in.

On Sunday, May 22, you'll have your choice – either the Henry Ford Museum or Greenfield Village – both if you move quickly! Tickets may be purchased in advance (<u>http://www.thehenryford.org/visit/tickets.aspx</u>) (\$17-26 individually, \$29.50-36.50 in combinations) and you'll get a voucher to redeem. For those who can stay over, we'll have dinner at the Inn – either the Ten Eyck Tavern or Edison's.

On Monday, May 23, we'll leave the hotel at 9:00 to get to the Henry Ford Museum by 9:10 to check in for the 9:20 bus to the Ford Rouge Plant Tour. Lunch afterward will be at Michigan Café in the Henry Ford Museum before we head south and home to Cincinnati.
